Need

Haiti is the poorest country in the Americas, with a GDP per capita of US \$846 in 2020. Out of Haiti's 10.4 million residents, more than 6 million (59%) live under the national poverty line of US \$2.42 a day, and more than 2.5 million (24%) live under the national extreme poverty line of US \$1.23 a day.

Though Haiti has 15,200 primary schools, 90% of them are private and managed by communities, religious organizations, or NGOs. Since many of the country's population struggle financially, the enrollment rate for primary school is only 67%, and fewer than 30% of students reach 6th grade. Haiti's literacy rate is 52.9%. The country is also still struggling to recover from the 2010 earthquake that crippled its resources and infrastructure.

Haiti was able to feed itself 50 years ago, but policy changes have now made it dependent on outside countries for 50% of all its food, and for 80% of its staple food, rice. Aid that is provided is generally not sustainable by the residents receiving it, increasing their dependency. Education is critical for helping families become self-sufficient and for helping communities.

grow, and this has been recognized by the United Nations via educational initiatives such as the Decade of Education for Sustainable Development (2010 - 2020).

Education has a myriad of benefits, such as reducing poverty, increasing crop yield, boosting economic growth, and improving health. Even one extra year of schooling makes a difference, increasing earnings by up to 10%, while Sub-Saharan Africa agricultural output would be increased by over 25%. Being able to work more efficiently also means more money means a person can support their family—and still has money to spend on other goods.

Haiti also suffers from the world's largest cholera epidemic, having lost more than 8,900 people since its initial outbreak in October 2014. This is partially due to Haiti having the lowest levels of access to drinking water and sanitation in the Americas, which makes it extremely difficult to reduce cholera's--a water-borne disease--impact. But when the other option is not to drink anything, cholera is a risk that must be taken.

Meanwhile, approximately 25% of young children suffer from chronic

malnutrition all over the globe, while 67% of the entire population has days they will go without food. Natural disasters increase the loss of crops and cattle, and

fields were abandoned when cut tariffs on imported rice drove many locals out of the market. Families are handing their children over to orphanages to ensure they are fed.

Chronic hunger leads to a variety of issues, such as reduced motor skills, low energy levels, stress, behavioral issues, low motivation, delayed cognitive, social, and emotional development, limited focus, and other health issues due to a lack of vital vitamins and minerals.

Access to enough nutritional food provides many critical health benefits. For children under two, it provides them with vitamins and minerals

necessary to ensure optimal brain development. Adequate nutrition also helps children improve behavior and achieve higher grades, increases happiness, reduces stress, improves focus and strengthens their immune system.

The items will be received by a representative of our organization, as we plan to have an office in Haiti, and distributed to those who demonstrate the greatest need. Any cash that is collected in the U.S. will be forwarded to our Haiti-based board or staff, who will then distribute funds as has been approved by the Board of Directors. Members of the U.S.-based board will travel to Haiti to provide supervision and oversight of our programming month. We have established a relationship with many schools in Haiti, and plan on established that relationship to other countries in need all over the globe in which we will work together to assist their students, with necessities such as food and clean water, health care and others. We will implement various programs such as a hot meal plate and food kit program in Haiti and Belle Glade, Florida, especially during the summer.

Through this present time 882 students received a hot meal plate a day for a number of 54 calendar school days last year, in September 2025 we introduced a school kit supplies program (SKSP) in which each student received (a backpack, notebooks, pens, pencils, erasers, pencil sharpener, rulers etc.), and an yearend gift program (EYGP) in December 2025.
